



To actively promote and work for the advancement of "Saint Louis Corvette Club" and its activities. To respect the differences and wishes of each Saint Louis Corvette Club member.

Proposed Revision: Article I, Section 2: PURPOSE OF THE CLUB

**Purpose:** To enjoy the Corvette through association with other Corvette owners. To have fun on many levels through social events, road trips, car shows, charity events and competition as each person wishes. To actively promote and work for the advancement of "Saint Louis Corvette Club" and its activities. To respect the differences and wishes of each Saint Louis Corvette Club member. <u>To promote, and participate in, the activities of NCCC.</u>

## **<u>Current:</u>** Article III, Section 2: **MEMBERSHIP STATUS** (5<sup>th</sup> bullet)

NCCC Membership: Any person who has paid dues to the NCCC and abides by the by-laws will be extended all of the rights and privileges offered by the NCCC.

**Proposed Revision:** Article III, Section 2: **MEMBERSHIP STATUS** (5<sup>th</sup> bullet)

NCCC Membership: All Saint Louis Corvette Club members will be NCCC members and will be extended all of the rights and privileges offered by the NCCC.

## **Current:** Article III, Section 3: **MEMBERSHIP FEES**

Membership dues for Corvette owner members shall be \$20.00 per person plus NCCC dues and an optional \$10.00 for "NCCC spouse" upon application for membership. This fee is to be paid prior to the November meeting. New members joining between September 1 and November 1 will be considered paid through November of the following year. Honorary members and club sponsors are exempt from these fees.

## **Proposed Revision:** Article III, Section 3: **MEMBERSHIP FEES**

Membership dues for Corvette owner members shall be \$20.00 per person plus NCCC dues upon application for membership. This fee is to be paid prior to the start of the November meeting. New members joining between June 1 and August 31 will pay one half (½) current membership dues plus NCCC dues upon application for membership. New members joining between September 1 and November 1 will be considered paid through November of the following year. Honorary members and club sponsors are exempt from these fees.

"The Last Sting Ray," part of the popular American Musclecar programming lineup, is written and produced by Stan Rarden of Restoration Productions LLC. The documentary consists of six half-hour episodes that tell three parallel stories -- the history of the Corvette, the life and times of America's most beloved automobile and the discovery and loving restoration of this automotive icon.

The documentary is scheduled to begin airing Dec. 7 on SPEED, but in a special "sneak preview," SPEED will air all six episodes of "The Last Sting Ray" back-to-back, beginning at 9 p.m. E.T. on Nov. 24. "The Last Sting Ray" will be the climax of a day-after-Thanksgiving American Musclecar marathon on SPEED.


"The Corvette is the most influential American car ever produced, and this particular 'Vette is the last one of the most beloved version GM ever made," Rarden said. "The journey of this car from the bustling General Motors factory in St. Louis to quiet, rural Napoleon, Ohio, home to the world's largest and most dynamic classic Corvette collection, is a story which will appeal to automotive enthusiasts and collectors everywhere."

The "Last" is the 186,981st produced by General Motors and is documented as the last 1967 Corvette (VIN #22940) of the C2 series production -- widely regarded by collectors and enthusiasts as the greatest Corvette design. It is also the last factory 427 cid mid-year big-block ever built. This combination of significant "lasts" is what makes VIN #22940 so valuable.

Since June 2005, the vehicle was treated to an extensive restoration at Nabers Brothers in Houston and was granted "Top Flight" certification from the National Corvette Restorers Society (NCRS), GoldCertification® at the 2006 Bloomington Gold Corvette show and a Lion Award at the Meadow Brook Concours d'Elegance.

Built on July 12, 1967, the "Last" Corvette still bears its original factory tank sticker (build sheet) listing the following otions: \* 986 Silver Pearl paint \* L-36 427-390 engine package \* C60 factory air conditioning \* N14 side dual exhaust \* N36 telescopic steering wheel \* N40 power steering.
