

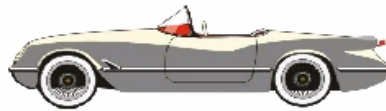

Carl Ballinger made a motion to accept the minutes from the August 7, 2007 meeting. Patty Craig provided the second to the motion and it was approved by the membership.

Membership Report

Kentucky has awarded a grant to the museum to be used for educational enhancements including driving simulators.

VA Hospital

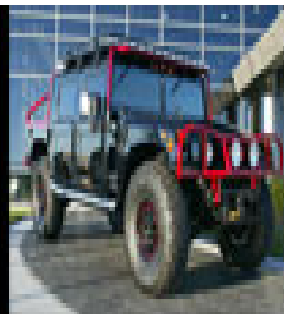
