

## Corvette Buyers Tour. Watching your Corvette being built. Day 1.

Once the color, interior and options are selected the order goes into a que. The order is verified three times between the factory and the dealer and a order number is generated. Buyers can then sign up at the Corvette Museum for a one to two day tour to follow the assembly of their new Corvette. Lori at the Museum sent daily updates on the days and times for us to be present.

Have a hearty breakfast. James Guffey, our guide is a retired electrician who was in charge of keeping the lines moving. Mr. Guffey met us at 10am. He had tracked the location of our Vette. The engine and transmission were assembled a few minutes earlier so we viewed the process and moved on to watch the body assembly. The body was high in the air. Fuel tanks, fuel lines, lower body panels, and underneath parts were added station by station. We walked slowly along. Mr. Guffey knew many of the workers and everyone was happy to talk to the new owners. At one point we were allowed to sit inside the nearly completed body to feel the interior and check out the controls.

The "marriage" is a major event in the assembly process. The body comes down and the engine and chassis roll underneath. Workers guide the parts and the two join with a quiet thump. Exhaust system, tires and fluids are added. We were invited to sit inside again as a computer ran tests then, the magic moment when I pressed the start button for the first time ever. The engine started and ran smoothly, everyone smiled.

Mr. Guffey recounted the story of a buyer who came to watch the assembly of his silver roadster only when they found it – it was red. A quick check verified that the dealer had ordered the wrong color. The buyer was very upset but followed the assembly anyway. By the time the Vette rolled off the line, the buyer was totally in love with his new red Corvette.

#### Day 2.

At 6:15am the assembly line rolled again. Final inspection for all fits and paint quality. The foreman invited me to start the engine and we got a quick picture of the odometer with zero miles. The Vette was driven to a station for wheel and light alignment. I joined the technician and we rolled into the chassis dyno. 800 checks for engine and chassis systems are performed in 3 minutes. Several runs up to 70 mph or better verified transmission and engine settings were correct. We left our new Vette in a hurricane of water to check for leaks.

At many stations along the way the workers came to see us, shake our hand and say thanks for buying a Corvette. The feeling was genuine.


