On Behalf of Jackie and Charlie:

Our charity is Love U2 Pieces. This is a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization located locally in Fenton, MO. This organization is a support for families and children with Autism.

Autism is so devastating, but yet few people know much about it. Autism is a disorder that can sneak up on a parent so quickly that it can turn their whole world upside down. That is what happened to our son, Michael and his wife Paola and to our ONLY grandson, Grant in December, 2011, at age 18 months.

After weeks of tears, waking up every morning begging God to let it be a bad dream, Paola was lucky enough to have been connected to Leigh Rolnicki and Love U2 Pieces.

When your child is diagnosed with a developmental disorder, there is no road map to follow. Each child with Autism Spectrum Disorder is so unique in their needs that they say, "If you have met one child with Autism, you have met one child with Autism".

Meeting Leigh and getting connected with Love U2 Pieces was the best thing that could have happened for Grant. Leigh began to make things happen with direction and coordination. Providing much appreciated guidance and emotional support, including getting our family connected with the right people and places. She has helped short cut many processes with her first-hand advice from also being a mother with an Autistic child. Her support was and is invaluable. Grant has come a long way. Intensive therapies daily, five days a week has allowed Grant to make remarkable progress. Thanks to Love U2 Pieces.

At age 3-1/2, Grant is the most loving little boy with a bigger vocabulary than a typical 5 year old. He loves swimming, playing soccer, reading books and attending school with his little friends.

The number of children being diagnosed with Autism is growing every year, but the people who are out there supporting the cause and making a difference in the lives of these families is not. One in 88 children will be stricken with Autism, 1-54 boys.

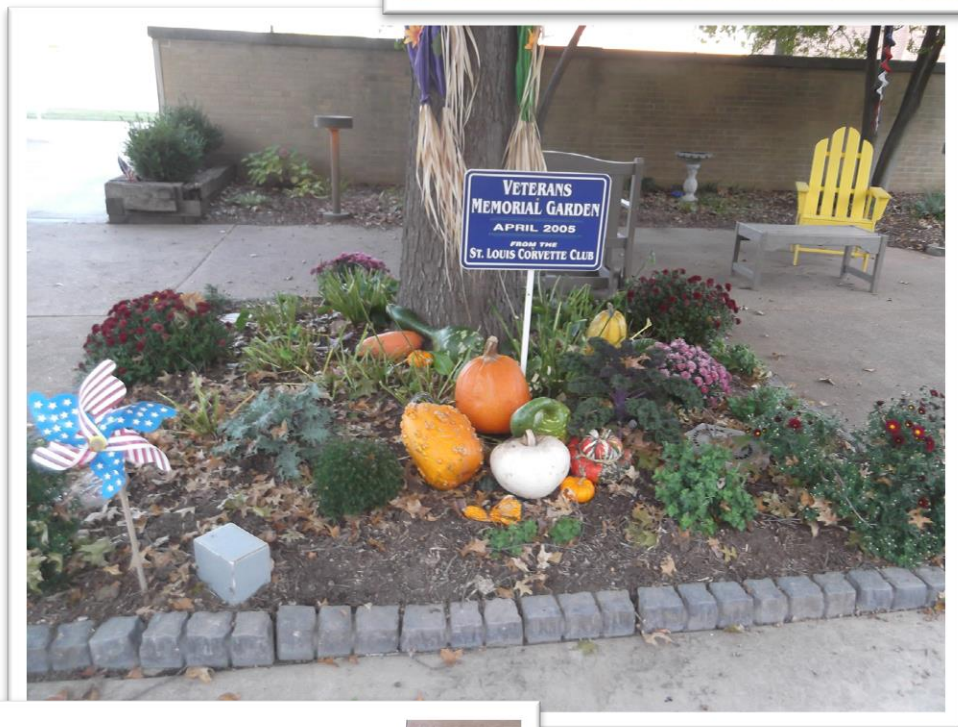
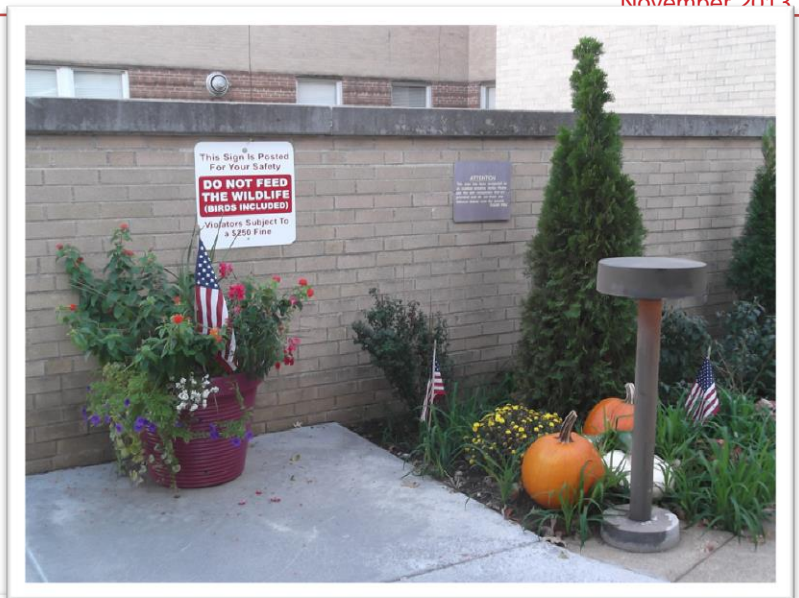

STLCC Recipes

I'm attaching a recipe for soft pretzels, like you can get at Auntie Anne's in the mall. Only these are way, way better. Some might even say they were addictive. Michael Zlatic's wife may or may not have eaten three in one day, they're so good. – Amy Zlatic

Awesome Soft Pretzel Recipe

Ingredients

4 teaspoons active dry yeast
1 teaspoon white sugar
1 1/4 cups warm water (110 degrees F/45 degrees C)
5 cups all-purpose flour
1/2 cup white sugar
1 1/2 teaspoons salt
1 tablespoon vegetable oil
1/2 cup baking soda
4 cups hot water
1/4 cup kosher salt, for topping

Directions

1. In a small bowl, dissolve yeast and 1 teaspoon sugar in warm water. Let stand until creamy, about 10 minutes.
2. In a large bowl, mix together flour, 1/2 cup sugar, and salt. Make a well in the center; add the oil and yeast mixture. Mix and form into a dough. If the mixture is dry, add one or tablespoons of water. Knead the dough until smooth, about 7 to 8 minutes. Lightly oil a large bowl, place the dough in the bowl and turn to coat with oil. Cover with plastic wrap and let rise in a warm place until doubled in size, about 1 hour.
3. Preheat oven to 450 degrees F (230 degrees C). In a large bowl, dissolve baking soda in hot water.
4. When risen, turn dough out onto a lightly floured surface and divide into 12 equal pieces. Roll each piece into a rope and twist into a pretzel shape. Once all the dough is shaped, dip each pretzel into the baking soda solution and place on a greased baking sheet. Sprinkle with kosher salt (if desired).
5. Bake in preheated oven for 8 minutes, until browned.

Why is the baking soda bath necessary? Old World Germans used to dip their brezels (pretzels) in a solution of sodium hydroxide (lye) and water before baking. Lye is a very strong and caustic alkaline. Because most people aren't comfortable mixing lye and water to make pretzels, baking soda - a much weaker alkaline - is now used in most pretzel recipes. Once the pretzels begin baking, a 'Maillard reaction' occurs. This is a chemical reaction sort of like caramelization, which allows the exterior crust to become a deep, rich brown color. The reaction accelerates in an alkaline environment which is provided by the baking soda bath. The baking soda, and the resulting reaction, is also responsible for the unique taste of the pretzel. Without the baking soda, the pretzel exterior ends up pale/white, and tastes more like bread. This baking soda/lye step is paramount in making a pretzel a pretzel.
