News from the National Corvette Museum

By now I think you have heard about the sinkhole at the National Corvette Museum. As bad as this is, we thank God that no one was in the building when this happened.

The cars will be restored with the help of Chevrolet. This process will be managed by GM design in Warren, Mich. The vehicles involved in this at the NCM are some of the most significant of automotive history. GM wants to ensure as many of the damaged cars are restored as soon as possible so fans from all over can enjoy them once again.

A timeline has been set for the sinkhole repair. A press conference was held on Feb. 13. Here are some of the highlights:

- -- It is repairable. The building foundation and structure is in good condition.
- -- They will be securing the sinkhole and surrounding areas to ensure that even if there are sinkholes on the property in the future it will not affect the Museum.
- -- It will take 2-3 weeks to stabilize and secure the area (the spire, walls of the sinkhole) then the process of vehicle recovery will begin.
- -- They will make sure the sinkhole is safe and that no further damage will occur before starting vehicle recovery.
- -- It will take 4-6 days to recover the cars.
- -- After that they will replace the earth and floor.

The NCM is confident that it will be finished in time for the Museum 20th anniversary celebration in August.

Dirty Shrimp and Beer

Ingredients:

- 2 lb shrimp peeled & deveined with tail
- 4 Tbsp coconut oil
- 2 tsp garlic
- 1 tsp oregano
- 1 tsp basil
- 1 tsp thyme
- 1 tsp cayenne pepper
- 1/2 tsp crushed red pepper flakes
- 1/2 cup beer (any kind)

Saute' garlic and herbs in coconut oil.

Add shrimp and cook until pink and done.

Pour in beer and simmer for 1-2 minutes.

Serve as an appetizer or as a meal with rice.
