



Then you would think that with all the police officers at the car show Ruth would watch what she says, so naturally this happened.






## **Club Hayride**



On Thursday, October 27, 2016 – the Goldmans picked up their 21<sup>st</sup> R8C Delivery Corvette – the most deliveries by a couple to date. Their love affair with Corvette started with the purchase of convertibles on even years. That was, until September 11, 2001. "After 9/11, no one was buying cars so GM started offering zero percent financing. That was the same year the Z06 came out. So instead of just having the convertible on even years, I started getting a Z06 on the odd years."

Ed trades in his Corvettes through his dealer, and while one reason he participates in the R8C Delivery Program is to keep his Corvettes off a truck, he says it is also the people at the NCM that bring them back. "We've gotten to know the people down here. Particularly in delivery." Ed remembers the early years when they would pick up their new Corvette in the spring. "When we first took delivery we would do it during what used to be known as the Birthday Bash, the C5 Registry Bash. It wasn't as crowded back then so they would do deliveries."

While many of our delivery customers select the option as an excuse to visit Bowling Green, Kentucky and have a mini vacation, for the Goldmans, the proximity helps to keep them coming back. "We're not very far away, in Cincinnati. You can survive I-65."

### Recipe

JoAnn Rogers brought this to the hayride and it went over so well it is reprinted here.

### PUMPKIN CRUNCH DESSERT

1 can pumpkin (16 oz.) 1 can Milnot Milk (13 oz.) 4 eggs 1 1/2 cups sugar 3 t. pumpkin pie spice 1 tsp salt

Mix all ingredients with electric mixer for 5 minutes. Pour into lightly greased 9 x 13 cake pan.

1 Box yellow cake mix (pudding cake mix okay)

Break up lumps and sprinkle dry cake mix evenly over mixture.

2 sticks melted butter (not margarine)

Drizzle evenly over cake mix so as not to have dry flour spots on cooked dessert.

1 cup toasted chopped pecans, or more if desired

Sprinkle pecans over complete mixture. Bake 1 hour at 350 degrees. May want to cover the pan with foil the last 20 minutes or so, so the nuts won't be too dark.

Great dessert for fall and Thanksgiving.
