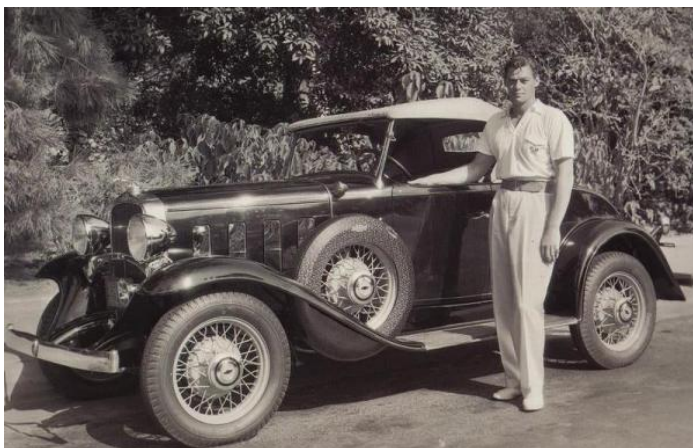

All of the desserts were outstanding as usual. I'm still in chocolate overload from Gail Mattler's cake! Here is a recipe from Sandy Kirby.

Fluffy Strawberry Pie

30 MIN Prep Time 9 HR 30 MIN Total Time 11 Ingredients

8 Servings



Ingredients

Pretzel Crust

- 1 1/4 cups crushed pretzels
- 1/4 cup granulated sugar
- 1/2 cup butter or margarine, melted

Pie

- 3/4 cup boiling water
- 1 package (4-serving size) strawberry-flavored gelatin
- 1 teaspoon grated lime peel
- 1/4 cup lime juice
- 1 1/2 cups whipping (heavy) cream
- 3/4 cup powdered sugar
- 2 cups strawberries, slightly crushed
- Chocolate-covered strawberries, if desired

Directions

1. In medium bowl, mix all crust ingredients. Press mixture firmly against bottom and side of 9-inch glass pie plate.
2. In large bowl, pour boiling water on gelatin; stir until gelatin is dissolved. Stir in lime peel and lime juice. Refrigerate about 1 hour or until very thick but not set.
3. Beat gelatin mixture with electric mixer on high speed about 4 minutes or until thick and fluffy; set aside. In chilled large bowl, beat whipping cream and powdered sugar on high speed until soft peaks form. Fold whipped cream and crushed strawberries into gelatin mixture. Pour into crust.
4. Refrigerate about 8 hours or until set. Garnish with chocolate-covered strawberries. Store covered in refrigerator.

Notes

Here is Gail's cake which I highly recommend. I guarantee there are no calories!

Heavenly Hash Cake

- 2 Sticks Butter (Melted)
- 2 Cups Sugar
- 4 Eggs
- 1 1/2 cups Flour
- 4 Tablespoons Cocoa
- 1 Cup chopped nuts

Cream together melted butter and sugar. Add eggs 1 at a time. Add rest of ingredients. Mix well. Bake in ungreased 9x13 pan for 30 min at 350 degrees.

Then take 1 jar Marshmallow Cream – drop by teaspoons over hot cake.

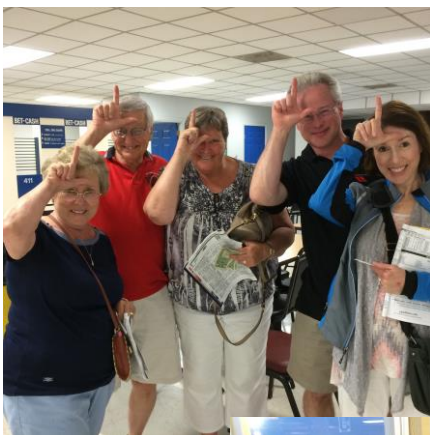
Icing

- 1/2 Cup Milnot
- 4 Tablespoons Butter
- 1/2 Cup Cocoa
- 1 Tsp Vanilla
- 3/4 Box Powdered Sugar

Mix together and spread on hot cake. Cool in refrigerator.

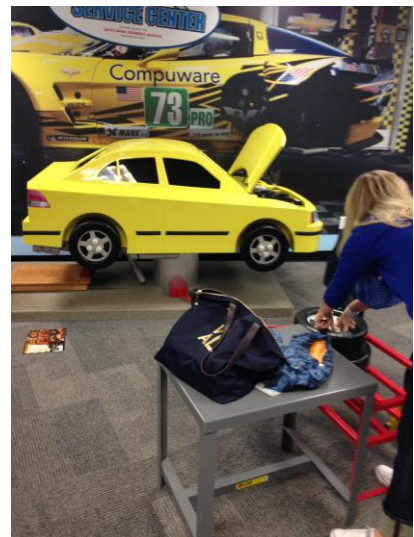
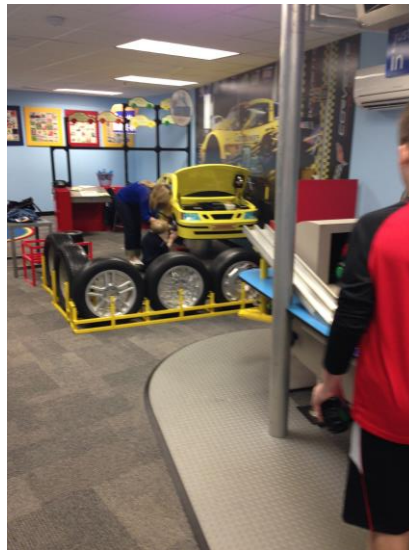

Bloomington Gold

The following article was posted on our Facebook page. Since I know not everyone is on Facebook I thought I would reprint it here. I also saw that former members Rich and Theresa Luebcke were there with their new club.

As Bloomington Gold comes to a close we have a neat story to share with you about this 1966 Corvette that was part of the 2016 Gold Year display.

Twenty five years ago, this Corvette, owned by Dale and Valerie Zeisset was a part of the Silver Salute display. The Zeissets even had their Silver Salute key ring on display with the car.

In the mid - 90s at Bloomington Gold in Springfield the Zeissets' Corvette was stolen while they were having dinner in downtown Springfield. Fortunately for them, there was an eye witness of the theft that led police to the person committing the crime.

Due to their persistence and detective work with local authorities, the man was arrested and their Corvette was recovered. They later learned their Corvette was the first of what was going to be many stolen that weekend. A professional auto theft ring had rented a large shed and had plans to steal many Corvettes that weekend!

And now 25 years later the same 1966 Corvette was proudly displayed in the Gold Year display. A true survivor! Thank you, Dale and Valerie, for sharing your story with us!



From the Historical Committee

Mack Yates

Mack founded the St Louis Corvette Club in 1953. Mack was a Flying Tiger in WWII and flew many missions in China. He became general manager of Barford Chevrolet in Ladue in the early 50s.

A high school friend and I were at the SCCA meeting in June '53. We flagged SCCA races so we could watch cornering and driving techniques. Mack and a small group were gathered at the end of the bar. Mack commented that they were having the first meeting of the St. Louis Corvette Club. No one had seen a Corvette but all in the group had ordered one.

In October of '53 Mack took a new Corvette off the showroom floor and raced it at Smart Field in St. Charles. The Vette did not do well – could not go and could not stop. The Jag 120s ran circles around the poor Corvette. In 1957 the 283 fuel injection engine became available and Mack built a real racer. Mack was Midwest champion for several years and raced in the SCCA nationals many times. Zora Duntov used to send Mack racing parts like brakes, cams and shocks to “evaluate”.

The Route 66 TV show used to exchange Corvettes at Barford each year as they filmed their way to Chicago. The Vettes were in terrible shape and Mack wholesaled them to a dealer in South Missouri.

Barford closed in the early 60s. Brown Shoe Co. next door wanted to expand and the land under Barford was extremely valuable. Mack purchased Suburban Ford in Kirkwood and bought the first of 7 USRRC 289 Cobras from Shelby for \$18,000. The Cobra was unbeatable and the Corvettes complained. The Cobra is still vintage racing and is valued in the millions. Mack's '57 Vette was found in Florida and fully restored as raced.
