The new space is tentatively scheduled to open in late 2022 or early 2023 and will allow the National Corvette Museum to provide a state-of-the-art educational experience geared directly to the

next generation of Corvette enthusiasts, engineers, designers and more.

Since 1953 the Corvette has been America's sports car. The National Corvette Museum was established and opened in 1994 as a 501(c)3 not-for-profit foundation. The mission of the National Corvette Museum is to celebrate the Corvettes invention and preserve the legendary vehicles past, present and future. The museum will serve as an educational research model for all to enjoy.

In 2021the NCM won 15 awards, had over 220,000 visitors, and added 5,716 members. 1,276 Corvettes we're delivered in the R8C program and 4,304 build sheets and window sticker orders were also filled.






