What We Do Matters!

It had been a busy weekend. Friday we had spent the day sightseeing with company from California. We got a late start and headed east on 94 then up into Alton and on up to Grafton to the Loading Dock for lunch. Took the ski-lift up to Aerie Resort to relax and enjoy the scenery. Headed back into Missouri on the ferry and met the rest of the family for dinner at a Mexican restaurant in St. Peters.

Saturday the entire family came together to celebrate a 35th wedding anniversary complete with lobster flown in that day from Maine. There were 15 adults and 4 kids ages 4 and under.

Sunday was to be a day to rest. Pat and I decided to have brunch at Bob Evans in South County and spend the afternoon at a winery in Kimmswick. Since we'd be outside, I opted to wear my Army Veteran cap.

The restaurant wasn't very crowded but one couple was prominent as they were about our age, but he was on an electrical mobility scooter. They were just about finished with their meal. As the couple was leaving, they paused at our table. "Thank you for your service," the man said. I responded, "You're welcome; I appreciate that." He asked me about the time I had served and where I had been stationed. He talked about how he had served in Vietnam and had been injured in combat. I thanked him for his serving and the sacrifice he had endured on behalf of our nation.

He talked of the many long months spent in Spinal Cord Injury Units at VA and

Military hospitals across the world. He said when he was told that his physical condition was his "new normal" he had a decision to make. He could sit around and be angry or he could find a job where he could, maybe, help people deal with their problems. He chose the latter; he got a job with the government helping patients in the Spinal Cord Injury Unit at JB seek out any benefits they are eligible to receive.

I said, "I need to tell you; I think you'll like this. We are members of a car club – it's a Corvette club. Since 2004 the club has participated in the Veterans Day Parade in downtown St. Louis. We have quite a few veterans in the group. But the priority on our calendar is that we also maintain a garden behind Bldg 52 at the VA Hospital in JB."


The man and his wife suddenly had huge smiles on their faces. "I know that garden," he said. "It's beautiful!"

He and I shook hands and the couple said goodbye and left.

So about 10 minutes later we were ready to go so I asked the waitress for the check. She returned in a few minutes and advised me that the meal is free today. "The couple who was sitting at that table over there paid it and made me promise not to tell you until after they left."
